



## Unaccompanied Minor Travel Process

- On most airlines (and there are a few notable exceptions), if a player is 14 years or younger, their parents will have to fill out a Travel Authorization Form for Athletes of Minority Age, when arriving at the airport for departure check in.
- The airline will provide their own unaccompanied minor travel form that must be completed at check-in. Please have your child keep that form and hand it to the team administrator once picked up at the airport.
- When your child gets to the airport, they will have to pay an Unaccompanied Minor Fee, which will range from \$40 one way to \$75 round trip. You **must** pay the Unaccompanied Minor Fee for **Round Trip** at the departing airport (for both the flight to Orlando International and the return flight home) if your airlines allows you to. Please ask if you can pay the fee for both flights at check-in. If the airline can only do this one way, please provide your child with enough money, so the ODP administrator can pay this for the return flight home.
- The names of the USL team administrators will be asked by the airline when checking in for departure. They are the only individuals who are allowed to pick your child up at the airport. Two weeks prior to the camp, the USL office will contact each family member that needs their child accompanied from the gate to the baggage claim and provide them with the name of the administrator that will meet them at the gate.
- Make sure your child has the cell phone number of the USL tour administrator in case any problems arise on your travels. Make sure they call right away if there are any issues that arise.

## Airline Unaccompanied Minor Policy



As of March 1, 2005

The policy for all airlines that the unaccompanied minor fee is applied is as followed:

Adult must fill out form when they are checked in with their name/address/phone number. They must list the person who is picking them up and also have name/address/phone number and that person must show photo ID before the child will be released to them. Always double check policy with airline. Also cannot take last flight of day (which includes between 9p-5am.)

The fee's and each airlines ages are as followed:

<b><u>Air Tran:</u></b>	Age 8-11 25.00 each way/50.00 roundtrip-nonstop or direct 40.00 connection each way/80.00 roundtrip Age 12-17 are considered adults
<b><u>Alaska Air</u></b>	Age 13-17 are considered adults Can request unaccompanied minor service for a fee Needs government issued photo ID
<b><u>America West:</u></b>	Age- 5-14 40.00 each way...will only allow non-stop flights. No connections.
<b><u>American:</u></b>	Age 5-14 40.00 on direct/75.00 connections each way.
<b><u>American Trans:</u></b>	Age 8-11 40.00 each way/nonstop or direct/75.00 connections ea way Age 12-17 are as adults
<b><u>Continental:</u></b>	Age 5-14 40.00 on direct/75.00 connection each way Cannot be booked on the last flight of the day.
<b><u>Delta:</u></b>	Age 5-14 40.00 each way/75.00 connection each way Cannot be booked on the last flight of the day.
<b><u>Frontier</u></b>	Age 15-17 are considered adults/ <b>5-14 non-stops only</b> Need Government issued photo ID / 40.00 fee
<b><u>JetBlue</u></b>	Age 5-11/no extra fee/nonstop or direct only Age 12-17 considered adults
<b><u>Northwest:</u></b>	Age 5-14 45.00 on direct/75.00 connection each way Cannot be booked on the last flight of the day.
<b><u>Southwest</u></b>	5-11 – Needs birth cert/or id showing age 12-17 is considered adults



**United:**

Age 5-7 nonstop only  
Age 8-11 nonstop/direct or connections  
60.00 each way  
Cannot take last flight of the day

**Usair:**

Age 5-7 nonstop or direct flights only  
Age 8-14 nonstop/direct or connections  
40.00 direct/75.00 connection each way  
Cannot be booked on last flight of day
